Neelkanth Mahadev Temple

Neelkanth Mahadev Temple is dedicated to Lord Shiva, who is known as Neelkanth, literally meaning the blue-throated one. It is a much-visited temple in Rishikesh, Uttarakhand, frequented throughout the year. The temple is an example of stunning architecture and stands at a height of 926 m on top of the Manikut hill across the National River Ganga, in the dense and lush Rajaji National Park. It is surrounded by the valleys of Manikoot, Brahmakoot, and Vishnukoot and is located at the confluence of the rivers Pankaja and Madhumati.

The mythological story from which the temple derives its name has great spiritual significance. The story shows Lord Shiva's divine example of courage and sacrifice as he drank and dissolved poison and held it within his throat (turning it blue), so that the nectar of immortality could immerge for the welfare of all. Hence, pilgrims flock from across the nation and around the world to have Darshan and feel the vibrations of this spiritual energy, where He actually meditated, so that they too, with His grace, can dissolve the poison in their lives and discover the nectar.

The Kanwad Yatra

The Kanwad Yatra is a annual festival celebrated with great pomp and grandeur in this temple during the Hindu month Shrawan Mas, the sacred time of monsoon. Kanwad actually refers to two ended bamboo pole filled with pitchers on both sides. Devotees sling this on their shoulder after filling the pitchers with Ganga Jal and then start their Kanwad Yatra walking by foot, often overcoming many difficulties, obstacles and performing great penance, from Haridwar / Rishikesh. Countless devotees wearing saffron t-shirt and shorts walk bare foot for miles singing bhajans, chanting mantras, shouting slogans such as 'Bole Bum Bum.' The partake in this yatra with full faith that Lord Shiva will bless and fulfil their desired wish.

During this Yatra, devotees arrive in lakhs and Government, along with NGO's, Ashrams and institutions, arranges facilities such as drinking water, washrooms, medicines etc to facilitate the pilgrimage.



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1. A CLEEN AND GREEN BEGINNING

Every year the Kanwad Yatra begins just after Guru Purnima in early July, however this year we had the special blessing of having HH Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswati Ji join the District Magistrate of Pauri Garhwal Dr. Ashish Kumar Chauhan Ji in planting the first phase of a special 'Sacred Rudraksh Van' (Van meaning forest) afforestation initiative at Kothar village near Neelkanth Mahadev Temple on Yoga Day the 21st June, 2023. On this occasion, Social Behavior Change Specialist UNICEF India Ms. Shalini Prasad ji, villagers, volunteers, Rishikumars and others joined together for this special greening drive, setting the vision and mission of the Kanwad Yatra to be clean, green and serene.

During the drive, it was pledged that 1000 Rudraksh saplings would be planted during the course of the Shrawan Mas. In addition, a special Amrit Sarovar (watershed) Project for the wildlife and elephants living in Rajaji National Park was also proposed and discussed by Pujya Swamiji.





2. AN INTEGRATED APPROACH & INAUGURATION

Parmarth Niketan was proud to host the first District Meeting of police personnel with all the relevant departments, officers, presided by the Hon'ble District Magistrate Dr Ashish Chauhan ji, Hon'ble SSP Smt Shweta Choubhey Ji, Hon'ble SDMs and many other respected officials the day following Guru Purnima (4th July).

The meeting was an integrated approach to bring all departments together on one platform in ensuring a smooth, seamless and successful Kanwad Mela. Traffic control, provision of basic facilities, infrastructural support as well as many other important points were discussed. The Hon'ble DM lauded the support and efforts of organisations and ashrams like Parmarth Niketan to welcome and serve the pilgrims of the Kanwad Yatra. After the meeting, he also visited the Harpic World Toilet College at Parmarth Niketan and was happy to learn about the work being done to train and empower Safai Karamcharis (sanitation workers).





3. BEGINNING OF THE SERVICE INITIATIVES

Thereafter the Kanwad Mela 2023 service initiatives at the Parmarth Camp was formally inaugurated by the Hon'ble DM Dr.Ashish Chauhan Ji was welcomed by Sushri Ganga Nandini Ji, Director of Projects, Global Interfaith WASH Alliance and many other dedicated doctors and sevaks for a symbolic lamp lighting ceremony.

This year our services were made possible by the seamless collaboration between the Global Interfaith WASH Alliance together with Parmarth Niketan, with the generous support of Bajaj Allianz, in association with National Health Mission, the Harpic World Toilet College, Divine Shakti Foundation and Ganga Action Parivar.

A record-breaking turnout of almost 40 million devotees from all corners of the country visited Uttarakhand during just this time of the Kanwad Mela!

HIGHLIGHTS ***

5. FREE MEDICAL CAMP

The dedicated team of sevaks organised a free medical camp, providing essential healthcare services to the devotees undertaking the Kanwad Yatra. With love and compassion, they attended to a staggering number of over 20,000 patients during the nearly twenty day medical camp.

A wide range of medical issues, including physical fatigue, injuries, fever, cough, and skin allergies were addressed, ensuring the pilgrim's physical well-being, enabling them to complete their sacred journey with ease and comfort.





6. AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

The Kanwad Mela 2023 witnessed a comprehensive awareness campaign focused on environmental conservation. Engaging puppet shows, pledge taking ceremonies and hand hygiene sessions effectively conveyed the message of Swachh Kanwad, urging the devotees to keep the environment clean and reduce the impact of single-use plastic.

Over 800 Kanwadis were inspired by the puppet shows, whilst more than 500 Kanwadis took the Swachh Kanwad pledge. This collective effort aimed to safeguard the sacred Ganga and her tributaries, fostering a sense of responsibility among the pilgrims towards the environment.



7. YOGA & MEDITATION SESSIONS



Amidst the bustling atmosphere of the Kanwad Mela, yoga and meditation sessions provided moments of peace and tranquility. Led by experienced yoga teachers, the sessions focused on yoga postures, breathing techniques, and meditation practices, offering pilgrims an opportunity to restore their limbs whilst rejuvenating their bodies and minds. These sessions enabled the Kanwadiyas to prepare themselves spiritually and physically to arrive at their destination and to find solace and inner strength during their arduous journey.





8. HOARDINGS & SIGNAGES

More than 100 strategically placed hoardings and signages conveyed essential messages related to cleanliness, environmental conservation, and the significance of the Kanwad Yatra. These visually impactful displays served as constant reminders, inspiring the pilgrims to be responsible custodians of nature. The well-organised signages facilitated way finding and provided essential information, ensuring a smooth and organised flow of the pilgrimage. A special selfie point was set up near the medical camp which was enjoyed by the Yatris.

9. JAL MANDIR & DUSTBINS



To cater to the basic needs of the pilgrims, 10 Jal Mandirs (water stations) were established at various points along the Kanwad Yatra route, at every 300 metres. A dedicated team of sevaks diligently refilled the water stations four times daily, each holding over 500 litres of potable water, resulting in the provision of more than 252,000 litres of clean drinking water to Kanwadis at these water stations, enabling pilgrims to stay hydrated and combat the impact of summer heat and humidity during the yatra.



10. CLEANLINESS RALLY &





DISTRIBUTION OF TULSI SAPLINGS

Acharyas and Rishikumars conducted a cleanliness rally on Neelkanth Marg, spreading the message of cleanliness to the Kanwadis, emphasising the importance of sanitation, health, and social well-being. Additionally, Tulsi saplings were distributed, which are a sacred plant for Hindus. The saplings were distributed to the Kanwadiyas (pilgrims of the Kanwad Yatra), encouraging them to plant more trees and advocate for environmental conservation in their communities.





Harela is a Hindu festival celebrated in Uttarakhand and in some regions of Himachal Pradesh during the time of Shravan Mas. Harela means 'Day of Green', and the agriculture-based communities in the region consider it highly auspicious, as it marks the beginning of the sowing cycle in their fields. Harela Parv is celebrated for a good harvest and prosperity and farmers sow in their fields and many plant trees near their homes on this day.


Hence as a tribute to Harela, all the volunteers of DSF, GIWA and Rishikumars of Parmarth Gurukul together planted Rudraksh and many other saplings in diverse locations along the Neelkanth Mahadev Route as they rallied together in their commitment to keep these regions clean and green for all.



12. SHRAVAN SHIVRATRI

This year the Shrawan Mas Kanwad Yatra saw it's peak days in the first twenty days of July, but the tithi (lunar day) as per the Hindu Calendar was actually until the 31st August, 2023 (Raksha Bandhan), making it one of the longest Shrawan Mas in the past few years. It is at this time that devotees of Lord Shiva worship and observe fasts, especially on Monday (Somwar) which are believed to be the day of the week where we are especially able to receive the energy of Shiva. Thereby devotees especially pray during this time for the grace of Mahadev and Maa Parvati to be upon them.

Hence, in addition to our seva initiatives, we also organised special Ganga Aarti every evening, inspiring pledges and awareness through the example of faith based action and the medium of devotion. Parmarth hosted free and regular bhandaras, Kathas and meals for all Rishikumars, pilgrims and devotees within the Ashram campus. Parmarth also hosted a special open and free Shrawan Shivratri celebrated in person and online, graced by Pujya Swamiji and Sadhviji who joined from America, where at the feet of Lord Shiva in Rishikesh hundreds of devotees partook in the Rudra Abhishek in a very powerful prayer ceremony.



13. RECORD FLOODS RAIN

Upon Pujya Swamiji's return from abroad this year at the end of July, He sought the blessings of Maa Ganga and Lord Shiva and inspired countless activities and service initiatives to provide relief and free support services to the Himalayan regions devastated by the monsoon floods.



On the 15th of August, the River Ganga rose to unprecedented height which became viral on news media, illustrating the wrath and the power of Mother Nature, further intensifying our messaging to keep our sacred soil and our environment protected through mitigating climate change and ensuring environmental sustainability. Our schools and gurukuls celebrated a special weeklong green Independence Day campaign 'Meri Mitti, Mera Desh' (My Soil, My Country). Our schools also gave the message of environmental protection by celebrating 'Vriksha Bandhan' during Raksha Bandhan. Raksha Bandhan is a beautiful occasion which illuminates the true love between brother and sister and also enriches the value of brotherhood/sisterhood among all people. By symbolically tying rakhis to trees in addition to our wrists, we also pledged to protect all of the Mother Nature, which of course in turn protects us.
